Swimming

100 % of Year 6 children in 2020/21 could swim competently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.

91% of Year 6 children could use a range of swimming techniques. (children did not have enough time to develop four full strokes even though lessons were one hour long over several weeks due to COVID).

100% of Year 6 pupils could perform self-rescue.

This plan carries over many of the action from 2020/21 due to the hold on CPD, Competitive Sport and mixing of large groups of children due to COVID.
