# SAFER SCHOOLS

Thankyou to those who returned the Safer Schools questionnaire. These were analysed for Monday's meeting and were very positive. There



were a couple of comments about there being no signage to the school in the village. There is one sign at the bottom of the Glat which also notes that there is no vehicular access via The Glat. Whilst the route opposite the medical practice is a public footpath it is also a private drive. School users access this by car with permission from Mr Whitley. It is felt that having signage at the bottom may encourage unauthorised users driving up, putting pedestrians at risk and further damaging the surface of the path.

Thankyou, also, for taking heed of the yellow road markings and also parking considerately, especially along High Street. The Parish Council has heard from residents commenting on how much improved the parking situation has been of late.

We have spoken with the children about what to do in the event of someone moving around school without one of the lanyards (staff/visitor) around their neck. These individuals should, rightly, be challenged by staff and asked to report to the office. On high visitor number days, visitors may be given a "visitor" sticker to wear.

#### WHAT 3 WORDS

Have you considered finding the What 3 Words app to identify your location? The emergency services

are increasingly using this



service to identify incident locations. There is often little 'local knowledge' in the control rooms but What 3 Words can help identify where a caller is located. It all works by splitting the globe into 3 metre squares. Each square has its own, unique set of 3 words. This allows the user to locate that square anywhere in the world! The 3 words for the school office are "teachers.toolkit.newer". You do need to be careful if using the three words to give someone your location that you speak clearly and clarify any words that may be misheard, especially words with plurals. "teacher.toolkit.newer" (no s on teacher) takes you to China!
