#### MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Any medication that the children need to have administered in school must be accompanied by a parental agreement form (available on our website at <a href="http://www.clivecofeprimaryschool.co.uk/page/medication-in-school/26261">http://www.clivecofeprimaryschool.co.uk/page/medication-in-school/26261</a>).

In certain circumstances we can keep medication such as calpol or an antihistamine on an 'as required' basis. All medications are kept locked away or in the fridge to which the children have limited access. All medications should also be clearly labelled with the child's name. Thankyou for your cooperation.

We will now be texting home when children who have inhalers make use of them. The time and number of puffs will be noted in the text. Similarly, those children who have standing arrangements for antihistamine or calpol will have a text sent home.

#### SUN SAFETY

Now we are heading (hopefully) into the better, sunnier weather, it is timely to remind everyone about policies around sunscreen. We encourage the children to wear hats, covered shoulders and sunscreen. You will notice that the advice from *Skcin* is that



bucket hats are preferable to baseball type hats. This is because they better protect the face and neck from the harmful effects of UV. The 'spare' hats that we hold in school will be the bucket hat type. However, any hat is much better than no hat!

We cannot apply sunscreen for your child unless we have express permission in writing. Clarification: the children need to bring their own sunscreen. School will only be able to provide sunscreen for those who have forgotten, or are unable to access, their own. There are lots of sunscreen products that enable even very young children to apply their own cream. The children must not share sunscreen with others in case of allergic reactions. Ideally, water bottles (with water please) are also essential for individuals so they can maintain good hydration.
