There is currently a fake email appearing which claims to be from the UK Government and informing you that all households will receive a one-off  $\pounds 600$  payment. The Subject line though tells you that you are eligible for "£400". As ever with scam emails the content is full of errors.

The header will look suspicious, as does the fake email address it has originated from, which is a .plus.com address.

After the second paragraph there is a clickable link – "You can apply here" – do not click this link.
