INFORMATION ABOUT MAJOR WORKS TAKING PLACE AT RAF SHAWBURY

RAF Shawbury is currently undergoing significant refurbishment works to maintain and enhance its capabilities both for the ongoing helicopter training requirements and the wider strategic requirements of the RAF, known as Agile Combat Employment (ACE). ACE is a strategic approach that enables air forces to operate from a variety of locations, enhancing flexibility and resilience. As with roads, runways and taxiways require regular maintenance to ensure that aircraft can operate safely, runway surfaces typically have a life of 20 years but this can vary with use and local conditions.

This significant project, covering runways, taxiways, dispersals and supporting infrastructure is taking place over some 18 months. You may have seen some of the associated works as you pass by on the B5063. To reduce road movements, e.g. bringing in concrete, a batching plant has been established to produce materials required for the work on site.

The main contractor Lagan Aviation & Infrastructure have also developed a traffic management plan to reduce impact on local roads, deconflicting where possible with peak times. While at RAF Shawbury Lagan Aviation & Infrastructure will also work closely with neighbouring businesses to create beneficial relationships and support the local economy wherever possible. This will include, employing local staff and companies and renting accommodation for their workers. The site is also registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme, which will ensure compliance with considerate construction practices and also provide another avenue for support for local people.

Highways safety: Damaged school crossing sign High Street

Night flying periods are usually for seven weeks with three weeks in between periods. There will be posts on the RAF Shawbury Facebook/Twitter advising on the night flying periods and we are grateful for the tolerance of this essential training. There is also information on the RAF Shawbury webpage with contact details for complaints or concerns. Night flying will commence typically 30 mins after sunset and may continue until 02:30.

Helium Balloons

There has been a recent occurrence where party type helium balloons drifted across the airfield. Such occurrences could endanger aircraft as well as ultimately being a hazard to wildlife. We would ask that if events are being held locally involving helium party type balloons that precautions are taken to prevent their inadvertent release.



Grinshill Parish Council May 2025 updates and more.

The Parish Council held a Parishioners meeting, Annual meeting and regular bi-monthly meeting as normal at Grinshill Village Hall

from 7pm on the 12th May 2025. This article will highlight a number of actions the Parish Council will be following through with and number of partners and **urgent help required from Parishioners.**





1. Parish Council Information:

The Parish Council continues to engage at a series of levels on behalf of Parishioners with a number of partners to improve the local area. The meetings held on the 12th May 2025 received reports from the new representative from RAF Shawbury Matt Williams from UK Military Flight Training at the base and the new Shropshire Councillor for the Shawbury Division Alison Williams who can be contacted at Alison.Williams@shropshire.gov.uk,

The Parish Council also elected Councillor David Walker as Chairman/ Environmental Co-ordinator, Councillor Gail Long as Vice Chair of the Parish Council, Councillor Simon Kelly to co-ordinate the website /IT and co-opted Councillor Tom Wycherley to lead on any planning applications. These details will be updated on the web site in due course.

Fix My Street is a key 'tool' to address flying tipping, pot holes and any other highway matter Parishioners are encouraged to down load the mobile app so if they become aware of the above concerns can report them directly to Shropshire Council. Grinshill Parish Council Clerk will continue to undertake an annual highways site inspection of the parish as part of the highways application fro the Environmental Maintenance Grant (EMG) to undertake improvements to drainage ditches, verges, street furniture and to reinforce pull-ins. As part of this site visit any highway defects will also be reported.

The three Parish Policing Priorities were also agreed at the meeting as speeding on the High Street, property theft and scamming. These will be reported to the Wem Neighbourhood Team so that they have a focus for their Policing within Grinshill. If Parishioners have any other Policing concerns please report them directly through by ring **999 in an emergency or 101 for all other matters.**

The local Member of Parliament for North Shropshire also provided an update on activity for the Parish Council which is copied and attached at the end of this article.

3. Police Advice on Mobile Phones: How can you protect yourself?

Never leave your phone. iPad or Tablet unattended, out of your sight or visible on a table in a public place, make sure your phone is not visibly protruding from your pocket where the opportunist can grab it. Never handover your phone to anyone you do not know, who may ask to "borrow" your phone to call a taxi for example. Be aware of your surroundings and only use your phone if it is safe to do so; in public places try and keep your back to a wall when using the phone, so no one can come behind you and grab the phone. Watch out for anyone behind you on public transport "shoulder surfing" to discover your PIN. Use of stronger passwords make it more difficult to "shoulder surf". On busy streets watch out for anyone on bikes or mopeds following you. When you have finished using it, make sure you put it away, out of sight. Never store Passwords on your phone.

4. Corbet Wood Projects:

The second phase of the wetland project at Corbet Wood has received grant support from Tesco's in Shrewsbury of £1,000 and will focus on additional tree works and the cutting back of foliage and planting of wetland plants.

The key to this element of the project is to to engage with volunteers from the village to help out in a practical way, anyone interested can contact the Clerk whose details are set out below. RAF Shawbury trainees are also being recruited to complete the steps project in the wood as well and path works.

5. Public Rights of Way (ROW) Project:

Parish Councillors are still at the early stages of this project undertaking the 'walking' element the 'walk' local rights of ways (ROW) across Grinshill. Parishioners wishing to get involved please contact the Clerk on the details set out below if they would like to be involved in this project. 'report' and 'repair' local rights of ways (ROW) across Grinshill.

6. IMPORTANT PUBLIC NOTICE:

After the local elections the Parish Council is still only at 50% capacity and requires four Parishioners interested in the local community to step forward and help sustain the Parish Council. At one stage over these last few months it was 'touch and go' if the a Parish Council for Grinshill would be able to function at all. So, over the next year a 'door to door, face to face' targeted campaign will be launch to talk with Parishioners to see what they value about a Parish Council for Grinshill and ask them to step forward to help. In the meantime if you would like to find out more please contact the Clerk.

7. Community Hub Project and Village Hall Lease updates:

Members of the Village Hall Management Committee joined the Annual Parishioners meeting to discuss with members of the Parish Council and others the situation with regard to the Community Hub Project and the Village Hall lease. Both the Parish Council and Village Hall Management Committee members present restated position with regard to the Community Hub Project, in that it requires a significant amount of people and resource to set up a charitable trust, project fund raise and produce a business plan. This could require a five to six year commitment at least and as no one has come forward to take the project onto its next stage the Community Hub Project has been 'put on one side' until that interest and commitment comes forward from with the parish.

The lease at the Village Hall needs to be renewed in 2027 if the Village Hall is to continue as a functioning venture in the Village. Early dialogue between the Parish Council, Village Hall Management Committee and Sansaw Estate have started to explore what might be within a set of 'heads of agreements' to start the process. The Village Hall Management Committee and the Parish Council remain committed to informing Parishioners further when there is more information on the draft 'heads of agreements' as part of a parish wide meeting which will be advised in due course.

It has been a busy start to the term. We sadly said goodbye to Ms Saunders at the end of last term. Year 6 have had an exciting adventure, travelling to Prees School to benefit from the highly experi-



enced teaching of Mr Hares as they complete the run up to the SATs in May. Meanwhile, back in school, everyone else has been busy settling into the new term with new topics to get on with. We have also welcomed 3 new members to our Nursery – Rowan, Otto and Ethan.

Dormouse Class (Nursery & Reception) will be learning about Water and Seas. Their Outdoor leaning will be focussed around the community veg garden - planting seeds & plugs, weeding and watering. This term, the Reception children will be travelling to Wem Swimming Centre for 10 weeks of lessons. We consider it a vital skill to be able to swim (potentially life saving) so dedicate time and finance to ensuring all year groups have swimming lessons during the year. By year 6, the vast majority of our children exceed the government expectation to swim 25 metres.

Red Squirrels are learning about Bees this term. Already, they have been very buzzy/busy in the garden! Later in the term they will be going to Home Farm, Attingham, where they will meet a beekeeper and his/her bees. After the half term break the Y1s will be undertaking their Phonics Check - a government assessment of phonics application.

Hedgehog Class are learning about Romans, Volcanoes and Earthquakes this term. A trip to Chester is planned later in the term - not Pompeii, although that will be discussed within the English topic! In Science they will be learning more about plants and healthy eating. Children in Year 4 will be undertaking the Multiplication Tables Check after the half term break.

Badger Class are travelling all over with their 'Where in the World' topic. They are looking at a variety of environmental issues this term and will be spending time considering the school's Climate Action Plan. At the time of writing, our Year 6 are preparing for their end of Keys Stage 2 SATs (Standard Assessment Test). We wish them well in these.

Numbers in school remain buoyant and we welcomed three new starters in Nursery after Easter and expecting one more after half term. We would always welcome expressions of interest in our Nursery which accommodates children from the term after their third (3) birthday. Helen Morgan Update May 2025

It's been nearly a year since I was re-elected as the MP for North Shropshire at the General Election.

Since then I have done my best to stand up for North Shropshire in Parliament and demand better for everyone in the constituency, whether you live in Grinshill or Gobowen.

Most weeks I am in Westminster for at least three days so that I am able to attend debates and vote on the laws being passed in Parliament.

Since the General Election I have spoken in the Commons 151 times on topics ranging from NHS waiting times to farming, the winter fuel allowance, rural mobile signal and access to public transport.

Meanwhile I've tabled 286 Written Parliamentary Questions to the Government. These cover a huge range of issues and help me to pressure Ministers to improve services in North Shropshire and interrogate the policies they are implementing.

If you are interested in reading more about what I've been saying in Parliament then you can see all my contributions on my page on the Parliament website.

Shortly after the election I was made the Liberal Democrat Spokesperson for Health and Care. Improving access to healthcare is a key priority for me and therefore I was pleased to be given such an important position. Here in North Shropshire ambulance and A&E waiting times remain far too long, as do waiting lists for cancer care and many other referrals. Meanwhile GP and NHS dental appointments can be very hard to access. And I haven't mentioned the big problem of social care!

These are all topics that I push the Government and local health leaders on every week and I will continue to do so until we see the improvements we need.


I am also the Chair of All-Party Parliamentary Groups on Flooding and Digital Communities. These groups are where MPs and Lords from all parties come together to work on issues they care about – in these cases supporting communities affected by flooding and working to improve mobile phone and broadband access in rural areas. As part of this work I recently concluded an inquiry into the digital landline switchover which affects many people in North Shropshire.

Away from Parliament much of my time is spent helping constituents and meeting local businesses, community groups, charities, schools and other

organisations.

Since I was first elected in 2021 I have supported constituents with more than 22,000 casework enquiries about all sorts of matters. I can't always solve the problem but I will always do my best to help.



Memories of Life During WW2



One evening last week looking in on ITV, I heard a documentary on World War 2, the subject being people that were left to carry on back home - people that were mobilized and worked in the ammunition factory etc. I worked at the Ordnance Factory at Swynnerton {Stoke, Staffs} from 1939 -1944.

I would like to tell you about a few of my wartime experiences. The first order was a Medical, I was 19 years old and very fit, working as a shop assistant in the Village Shop but there was a war on, and we had to obey orders. We had a choice the Land Army, Forces, or the Factory.

So, it was the factory for me, we were given a time and place, a coach would pick us up at various points in the village when we were all accounted for, off we went, we arrived at the factory. We were asked a lot of questions about the work we had been doing and selected for various parts of the factory.

I was a shop assistant, and I had some knowledge of weights and measures. I was sent to one of the shops where the Mercury & TNT powder was being used to fill the 303.55, 20 millimetres caps, this powder was very explosive and dangerous. This work was very tedious, there were about ten machines and three vibraters which vibrated the caps, onto the plates, we then had to rectify the caps which had gone in upside down, about 1,000 on each plate. If the caps were not put in correct, there would be a mighty explosion, The powder was then filled into the caps and pressed. It was very noisy, all the machines were always working pressers and varnishers etc.

Now that was a small part about my work on the production line.

King George & Queen Elizabeth visited the factory and Mrs Roosevelt the President's wife. My friend and I joined the First Aid, so we could wear our white arm band with the Red Cross, and we were able to be on the front,row and get a good view. The factory covered a vast area, the trains and coaches brought the workers in from all over the potteries and villages all around.


By this time, we began to think the war would never end, the powder was beginning to make our skin very itchy and some of the girls that worked in the yellow powder were worse off than us, their skin and hair turned yellow, but we all had to (grin and bear it etc). One morning in the shop, I worked in the "Blue-Band" that was the man in charge, asked if any of us would volunteer to do some training because a lot of the Mechanics and Engineers were being called up to go into the Army. He said he wanted six girls to volunteer to train to maintain the machines and become Female Fitters, so I and five others volunteered.

We were sent to train in Bolton, Lancashire, after about 9 months we were sent back to Swynnerton, we could now maintain the machines we worked for about 2 months and then we were told we had to have further training, this time we were sent to Birmingham to a Training Centre where we were taught Bench Fitting, tool making, it was very hard work.

So, when I look back and think of the danger, we were all in and the explosions that occurred, knowing that someone had lost a finger, an arm, we were all on the front line.




